For seven years, Rifka Rosenwein voiced the pleasures and frustrations of her life in "The Home Front," a monthly column in The New York Jewish Week. Together, the 64 columns collected in Life in the Present Tense are a death-defying celebration of life. At the age of 21, Penny Snow watched her father die - the victim of cancer of the colon. Fourteen years later she witnessed her mother's death from the same disease. This book aims to confront difficult emotions, and to help those who have lived, or are living in similar situations. However, our personal journeys led us to venture out on our own, dispersing across the country and creating families, careers, and diverse life experiences. We share these memories and reflections of our journeys for the enjoyment of our children, grandchildren, nephews, nieces, extended relatives, and friends. Our lives have been meaningful, eventful, and full of adventure, to say the least.
